We were hoping that the Park, or other alternate venues we investigated, would become available so we could proceed with the car show, but all venues are continuing to adhere to the current Virginia restriction of 25 persons per outdoor social gathering; we could not overcome that major obstacle.

We also felt we could not afford to risk spending Club funds on this year's show in hopes of a potential lastminute rule change, when the chances are high that we would end up having to cancel anyway.

The Apple Blossom Meet is the main fundraiser for the Region, so no decision regarding this event is made lightly; however, this year it simply isn't possible.

Let's all look forward to the Apple Blossom Meet in May 2022, when surely we will all be living without the shadow of this awful pandemic over our heads.






