

We are in the final stretch for our 63rd Apple Blossom Meet! The Committee Chairs have their committees coming together. Meet Chairman Duane Catlett has the trophies, Port-a-Johns, food vendor, and P.A. system lined up. Club members are set to bring and set up tents for the day, and the dash plaques are on hand. Thanks to the many members who helped to secure our Meet sponsors, J.C. Taylor, Stafford Chrysler/Jeep of Winchester, and Omps Funeral Home & Cremation Services, and to secure sponsors for the 31 Special Awards to be given out. 

Moving on from the auction, we worked our way over to the car corral, running into Bill Busko on the way. First, there's the Chevy pickup that Bill was helping sell. I've always had a soft spot for the 68-69 Montegos. This red 69 Mercury Montego MX convertible for \$16,000 was no exception.





Studebaker introduced the compact Lark in '59. This two-door wagon was

from that first model year.



The 383 4-speed '68 Super Bee was priced at \$59,900. 68 Super Bees are rather rare as they came out mid-year after Dodge division witnessed the success of the comparable Plymouth Road Runner.



There were actually more VWs in the auction than in the car corral, but this yellow bug was the nicest of them all. The \$38,000 67 4- speed Dart GT with a newer 340 under the hood seemed to be priced a little high to me.





Didn't notice the price on the 37 Chevy.

The 1916 Buick, priced at \$29,000,
was nice, but to me the best Buick in
the car corral was the stunning shadow
turquoise 67 Riviera priced at \$25.000.





Usually see the 60 Impala in black, white or red. The copper color on this 60 Impala really made it stand out. The bronze GTO convertible was certainly pretty, but the color looked like Chrysler's Turbine Bronze. Guessing it was a rarely seen correct Pontiac color though.





The 63 Pontiac Catalina 421 3 speed was a very accurate tribute to rare high

-performance Catalinas Pontiac built that year. Still, I heard people spectators proclaim it to be the most spectacular car in the car corral.



The Bronco was a little rusty, but 1st generation Bronco prices have shot through the roof in recent years, so the \$35,000 asking price might be fair. The 73 Chevelle woody wagon was once a common sight on suburban streets. Not many left now though.





When's the last time you saw a 65 Olds Starfire? The unique styling touches on these cars are the exhaust ports in the rear quarters. This one was priced at \$28,000.



The 85 Mercedes 300D diesel had 123k miles on it and was priced at \$16,500. It was a clean, 1 owner, example of a desirable diesel Mercedes.



The 66 Skylark convertible was a factory 4-speed car with just 34K original miles. The price was \$34,500. This Shelby Mustang convertible was one of two 68 Shelby Mustangs I saw in the car corral.





On a side note, arriving home after driving home from Spring Carlisle, I found a broken-down 67 Sport Fury parked in front of the house. Car died out on RT 7 and he coasted it onto my street to get out of traffic. I got home too late to be of assistance as the AAA rollback arrived just a few minutes after me. What were the chances that a classic Mopar would break down right in front of my house?







