JANUARY CAR OF THE MONTH:

Since the January 2024 Club calendar page was already turned before the Feb. issue, here's a "catch up" for January's Car of the Month.

"1926 PAIGE" by Eric Kirk

January's calendar page shows my 1926 Paige 6-72 sport touring sedan. This car came to Apple Blossom in the '60's when it was owned by Dick and Peggy McDonald. They restored the car in the late '50's, after rescuing it from a railroad yard in Williamsport, PA. I bought it in 1989 from them. It has been to many Apple Blossom Meets and to a National Meet and Graham National Meet in Williamsburg, VA. I have driven it to all these events. It was displayed for 5 years in the University of MD Ag Centers Transportation Museum in Sharpsburg, MD. Sitting for so long, it required a lot of mechanical restoration: brake and master cylinder restoration by White Post Restoration, gaskets by Olsen Gaskets in WA, Pease Vintage Parts in Palmer, MA., with much elbow grease applied by David Wilkins and myself. David loves this car and

A short drive to the borough of Queens from Long Island, a trip to the bank, and we had another old car. Jack believed it was serendipity as the color was blue, my favorite, it was a 1959, the same year I was born, plus it was a push button automatic that I could drive. The stars were aligned. We've been owners of our 1959 Rambler since 1995. It's the one car that we have the longest in our garage.

<u> His</u>:

In October 2012, we were out and came home to see a green Mercury Montego sitting in our driveway. We didn't know anyone with a 70's green Mercury. Jack had owned the same car but in a different color when he was 20 years old. Jack reminisced a lot about his Montego and always wanted to find one to purchase but never did. As we walked around to our front porch, Jack's brother was sitting on our steps with the keys to the car and wished his brother Happy 60th Birthday. Jack's brother found the Mercury Montego GT on Ebay, did some research, checked with the local sheriff to make sure it wasn't a scam (the sheriff actually knew the seller), purchased the vehicle, and had it shipped from Minnesota to Long Island. What a 60th birthday present! A memory we will never forget.






reflecting the wall.]

pedal to make it easier to crank and then, most importantly, to retard the ignition timing so the engine fires after top dead center. Otherwise, if it fires before TDC it will most likely kick back and you will possibly end up with a broken arm. (I have accidently tested this theory several times and fortunately have not broken any bones but believe me "it ain't no fun!!") So around the neighborhood we went a few times and amazingly we made it back to the house without stalling. I WAS HOOKED!!!

I would go to visit Bob and the REO several times every year, going to car shows with him and Sue. I enjoyed the REO and the other cars in his collection which included a 1913 Model T Touring, a 1906 Success, and an Elmore which was manufactured in nearby Elmore, OH. We have shared an untold amount of time together going to car shows, touring a week each year with the Vintage Motor Car Club of America's 1 & 2 Cylinder Tour held in June every year, and showing the REO at The Old Car Festival at Greenfield Village in Dearborn, MI. For those not familiar with TOCF it is held on the 2nd weekend in September and is limited to about 750 vehicles no newer than 1932. It is a 2-day show and is worth the trip to show a vehicle or just be a spectator enjoying the many vehicles on display.


Let's all make this a fun-filled year by participating in some of the many shows in the area or just going to check out what other collectors have. Keep a close watch on the show list tha







- At 0.3 miles, turn right at the Church rear driveway (Trinity Lane) and uphill into the parking lot. There is a sign at the driveway entrance.

Fellowship Hall entry is at the bottom level, rear of the Church, off the parking lot. No stairs to climb.


