


Purchased by Edgar Rohr (member Chip's father) from a junkyard near Chambersburg in Pennsylvania in 1939. The original owner is unknown. He paid \$50 for the car, which had no title. DMV required a title, so he contacted the junkyard and eventually got a PA title but charged him an additional \$10 for 'time and effort" before sending the title to him. So, the total price for the car was \$60.



Edgar joined AACA in 1950. Edgar and Walser participated in their first Glidden Tour in 1951- and then did the following 12 Glidden Tours in a row. In 1955 Edgar drove the car to the Glidden Tour in Ontario, Canada and back to Virginia. We believe the Rohrs participated in a total of 26 Glidden Tours. They also participated in numerous other AACA tours. Edgar Rohr was a charter member of three AACA Regions in Virginia, including the Shenandoah Region. He served on the AACA National Board from 1960-1983 and




was AACA National President in 1963-1964. Edgar was also the Director of the 1983 Glidden Tour in Frederick, MD.

Chip grew up riding in the '12 Buick. He especially remembers many trips over the mountains to the National Capital Region Meet in Front Royal (which included trips to the Skyline Caverns on a Saturday afternoon and Sunday morning break THE SPLIT RIM

fast on the Skyline Drive!). Later there were trips over the mountain for the Shenandoah Region/Apple Blossom events. Another '12 Buick tradition was driving to all the Firemen's Parades and carnivals that most small towns had in the 1950's. Traffic was much different then, before the interstates, and the brass era cars could still be driven safely on the highways.

Chip and Nancy inherited the Buick in 1988. They participated in 5 Glidden Tours, winning the Glidden trophy on the 1999 Shenandoah Valley Tour. They have also participated in Vintage and Reliability Tours. The car led the 75th annual Greater Manassas Parade in 2022, one of the largest parades in Virginia. The car is shown annually at the Edgar Rohr Memorial Car Show hosted by the Bull Run Region of AACA every September in Manassas, Virginia, and has often been shown at the Shenandoah Region Apple Blossom Show.

Mike and Carol Witt were on several of the Glidden Tours with Chip and Nancy, including the 2021 Tour in Saratoga Springs, NY, where the car developed problems and was unable to finish the Tour. Mike performed repairs on the car to prepare it for the 75th Manassas Christmas Parade. This may not have been a coincidence, because last year Chip decided to part with the car. After much consideration the Rohrs determined they were no longer able to tour in the car but did not want it to sit in the garage – only to be shown several times a year.

Enter Mike and Carol ! Mike and Carol are in the process of buying the car and fully intend to continue to tour in it... What a perfect solution !!

FROM JIM COLVILLE: SPRING CARLISLE APR 17-21

For me, the car show season opens every year on the third weekend of April. That's the weekend of Spring Carlisle. I always make sure I have room in my schedule for one day at Spring Carlisle. It's not that Spring Carlisle has much to offer for the Mopar fan, but it is a huge car event that signals the end of the long winter's nap for the classic cars. It has become a sort of tradition for us to go on Thursday for Spring Carlisle. Thursday morning my friends and I view the cars in the auction before they cross the auction block. Then we walk over to the car corral to see the cars for sale. A couple of cars worth a closer look were these two, displayed inside the auction building outside gate #3 - a '55 Dodge Custom Royal Lancer, and a '70 AMC Rebel Machine. In previous years we had noticed that more and





more of the classic cars were migrating from the car corral, over to the auction. This year was no different in that respect. What was different though, was the number of cars. In both the auction and the car corral, it seemed that there

were maybe half the number of vehicles we had seen last year. The vendor area, however, was packed. I don't think we noticed a single empty vendor space.

Among all the vehicles in the auction and the car corral, there were four that really stood out. The first was a 47,000 -mile survivor 1968 Mercury Colony Park wagon that was on its way to the fairgrounds. It was an amazing time capsule inside and out. The price was \$22,000. At the auction there were a few unusual models, like the windowed box van with the "PowerTrack" snow tracks, and the domestic market right





hand drive Toyota Granvia 4x4 diesel van. One of the few classic cars we found hiding in the vendor area was a pretty '56 Oldsmobile 88 with 33,000 miles (and aftermarket air conditioning), for an asking price of \$35,000. But we didn't spend much time in the vendor area. One buddy bought a new

in dash radio from Retro Sound for his Dart Swinger, and I spoke with a cou-



ple vendors about chroming for pot metal parts, and refinishing and reanodizing aluminum body trim. But that was the extent of our exploration into the vendor area.

Back in the auction, were a green 1980 Porsche 911, a red '55 Ford F-250 pickup, and a turquoise '70 Galaxie XL convertible. Next, a '60 Impala coupe, and a '75 Jeep Gladiator pickup.







Back over at the car corral were a '56 Ford Custom 2 door hardtop and a white '62 Pontiac Grand Prix with 52,000 miles priced at \$35,000. The red '62 Chevy Nova convertible was parked by itself up on the hill. We weren't gonna walk up there to see it,









thus the zoom lens on the camera came in handy. The emblem on the fender indicates a V8, but no V8 Novas ever left the factory. The V8 was added to the Chevy II Nova line in '64, but convertibles were only offered in '62 and '63.


Driving Directions to Round Hill Church

- At 0.3 miles, turn right at the Church rear driveway (Trinity Lane) and uphill into the parking lot. There is a sign at the driveway entrance.


Fellowship Hall entry is at the bottom level, rear of the Church, off the parking lot. No stairs to climb.
