This year’s Shawquon Ruritan 16th Annual Car, Truck, and Tractors Show registered fifty-one vehicles on the show field at Stephens City’s Newtown Commons on Saturday, August 3, 2024. Participation appeared limited this year (normally over 100 vehicles register) by the threat of pending thunderstorms and fierce competition from other car shows. Starting off with pleasant temperatures, the rain held off until the show ended about 2 pm. Raffle drawings and live auction were moved up slightly timewise to insure finishing up before the expected deluge. The variety of vehicles presented this year ranged from a 1908 REO Runabout with a single cylinder 8/10 hp engine placed under the hood, wheel steering, and wooden wheels, shown by Jeff Smulovitz, to Best of Show winner, Terry Carroll’s 1963 Chevy Impala, to purpose-built hot

rods, to fully restored cars, trucks, and tractors. Twenty trophies were awarded for 1982 vehicles and earlier, ten for 1983 and later, and eight for tractors.

Although participation and attendance were down from 2023, the Shawquon Ruritan Car Show was a success as the annual fundraiser supports the club’s high school scholarship program. In 2023, five \$1,000

CHRYSLERS AT CARLISLE**

I missed the July 11 membership meeting because it conflicted with Chrysler Carlisle, and I wasn't going to miss that show. I've attended every year since the very first Carlisle Chrysler Nationals back in '91. For Mopar fans, it's the largest Mopar event on the planet. Every year the show seems to get bigger. I haven't heard any official numbers yet, but every indication is that there were probably more show cars than last year's record of 3156 cars. Officially, the event is a Friday, Saturday, Sunday show. Unofficially, it's a Thursday, Friday, Saturday show with Sunday left just for awards. In the three days, I took well over 1500 photos. I'll start with a few of the many station wagons of various vintages, sizes and ages. Here, a rarely seen 1962 Valiant V-200 wagon.

We visited the Badlands National Park, temperature 114, Mount Rushmore temp. 109, Las Vegas temp. 108, and Joshua Tree National Park temp. 110. "But it's a dry heat"!!!! BAH HUMBUG!!!! IT'S STILL HOT!!! That being said, the sights were absolutely beautiful!!!! The formations and colors of the Badlands are indescribable. We also had a very close up visit with a Bison as we were about to exit the park. We arrived at Mount Rushmore in time to see the evening program and light show. The next morning, we went back to view it in the daylight. An absolutely awesome sight both day and night. If you get out there, be sure to visit the Sculptures Studio where you can see the actual 1/12 scale model used to make the measurements that were transferred to the mountainside to carve the actual figures.

Based on a time frame of wanting to be in Palm Springs on Saturday vs Sunday, we chose to skip

Yellowstone National Park. The website said that Old Faithful was scheduled to shoot off at 8:15 AM +/- 10 minutes and we knew we could not make that. So, we headed "directly" to Palm Springs via Las Vegas. We gained \$25 there and stopped by the Pawn Shop featured on the Pawn Stars tv program. Our next and final leg of the trip took us down Route 66 and through the Joshua Tree National Park. We stopped to check out the volcano that erupted many, many moons ago. Once we left the Park it was a short trip to Palm Springs. We had a fantastic trip, and no picture could show how awesome the views were. If anyone has thought about getting out to see any of the many wonderful sights we have here in the United States, I would recommend putting those thoughts into action.

The AMC Matador wagon was the only AMC wagon in the show, but there were several AMCs on display.



The 1965 Dodge Town Wagon would likely be considered more an SUV than a wagon, at least in today's terminology. It was one of three '50s/'60s Town Panel passenger wagons I spotted in the show. For those that think the Chrysler show at Carlisle is only for muscle car era Mopars, let me assure you, that is not the case. A sampling of early cars were also on display. First, a '50 Dodge convertible. The '35 Chry-



ler Airstream convertible was stunning. Most of the other Mopars from the '40s, and earlier, were street rods or rat rods. The Virgil Exner era of finned "Forward Look" Mopars is always well represented at the Chrysler show at Carlisle. There's always several '57-'59 Plymouths, probably due to the popularity of the movie, "Christine". The tur-

quoise '58 hardtop appeared factory correct inside and out, but hiding under the hood, was a modern "Hemi Demon" motor. Next, a '56 Chrysler New Yorker St. Regis.



There's always a few AMCs in the show and they have their own class. Standouts among the AMCs included a Levi's edition Gremlin, and the green '69 AMX, my favorite of the AMXs present.

CHRYSLERS CARLISLE, CONT'D:

There were special displays around the fairgrounds. Near the grandstand sat the only Brazilian Dodge Charger RT I've ever seen. I've been wanting to see one for a very long time. Now I can cross that off my bucket list. This one is a 1975 model. These cars were



powered by a 318 V8 with a 4 bbl carb. They were based on the American '69 Dodge Dart. But interior and exterior details were unique to the Brazilian cars. Up front was a split grille with vertical bars and quad hidden headlights reminiscent of an American '68 Charger. But on these cars the headlights showed through the grille. There were no headlight doors that flipped out of the way as on the American Charger. Hood louvers were borrowed from the '68 Dart GTS. Out back, the C-pillars were extended to give the Dart body a tunnel-back rear window, again like the late '60s Charger. Taillight lenses were recessed in their angled housing much like those of a '69 Road Runner or GTX.



Inside building T was a special display of "High Impact" color cars. Most were quite bright under the artificial lighting.

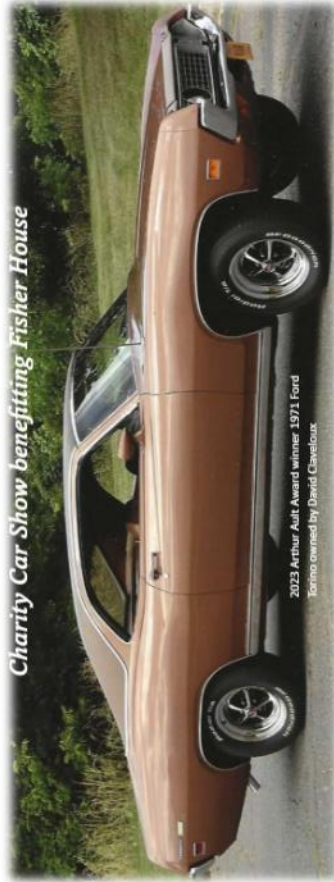

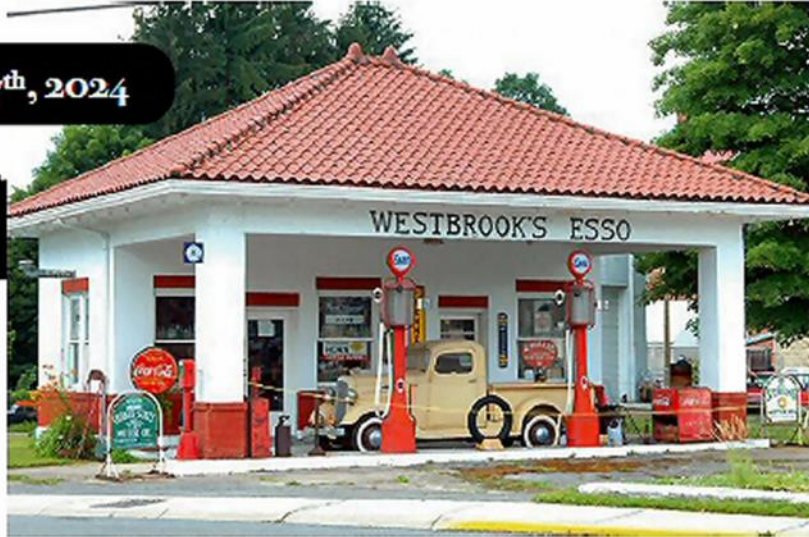

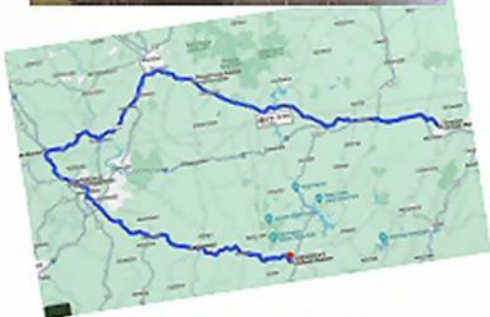

Although modern Mopars fill a large part of the show area, the main focus of the car show is the infield which is mostly full of cars from the '60s and '70s. A-body Plymouths include Valiants, Barracudas and Dusters. Among the A body Dodges were Darts, Demons and Dart Sports. There were many nicer '71 Demons, but this project car for sale in the vendor area was the first of the rare Demon Sizzlers that I've seen.



By far, the largest group of show cars were the mid-size Mopar B bodies. B bodies ran from 1962 up through the '70s. Badge names applied to B bodies in various years included Belvedere, Savoy, Fury, Sport Fury, Satellite, Sport Satellite, Satellite Sebring, Road Runner, GTX, Charger, Coronet, Polara, Polara 500, Magnum and Cordoba.

Chargers are always a big part of the event, and every year is well represented with several different cars. The '66-'67 Chargers wore a fastback body style like the gold car shown. The bright Sassy Grass green Charger is a '71 Super Bee model. The orange '68 Charger was a limited run of "Bengal" Chargers made for Cincinnati Dodge dealers. They were available with 318, 383 and 440 V8s, had special "Bengal" badges, and all were painted orange with black bumble bee stripes and black vinyl top to commemorate that city's football team. The most popular Chargers are the '68-'70 models like the turquoise '69 shown here.

The big C bodies were out in substantial numbers as well. Here, a '68 Newport convertible with the optional sports grain wood side paneling, a '65 300, a '70 300-Hurst, and '70 Sport Fury GT with a factory 440 six pack.



No Mopar show is complete without winged cars like the white Superbird and the yellow Daytona, or a Dukes of Hazzard Charger. There were several of each on display. A few of the E-body Dodge Challengers in the show included a "Vanishing Point" movie replica Challenger RT (at least two showed up this year). The yellow '70 Challenger RT SE shows off the small rear window exclusive to the SE models.



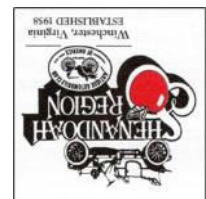
