



The '69 Olds 98 coupe was an especially clean example of a car that was once common yet now rarely seen. Craig Comontofski brought his '55 Studebaker.





It was a beautiful day for convertibles, including the '41 Buick and the '64 Mercury Comet shown here.

There are always plenty of MGs and Triumphs, but the red Stag is a rarely











seen Triumph. A couple more nice Buicks included a '63 Riviera and a '53 Skylark convertible. Among the Cadillacs were a couple of big fin '59s including the red DeVille convertible. The Opel GT was in the car corral.

FROM JIM COLVILLE: CHRYSLER CARLISLE - JULY

I missed the July membership meeting because it conflicted with Chrysler Carlisle, and I wasn't going to miss that show. I've attended every year since the very first Carlisle Chrysler Nationals back in '91. For Mopar fans, it's the largest Mopar event on the planet. The vendor area has grown as the car corral shrinks into a smaller and smaller area. Much of what used to be the car corral, is now vendor spaces, so there was a huge amount of territory to cover in a quest for hard-to-find Mopar parts. With my bad knee, I decided a mobility scooter rental was in order to make it possible for me to even cover the vendor area. My effort was rewarded as I found a decent pair of inner fender splash shields that I need for my '67 Belvedere wagon. The '66-'67 B-body inner fender splash shields are apparently made of "unobtainium", and, when found, are usually pretty rusty. Officially, the event is a Friday, Saturday, Sunday show. Unofficially, it's a Thursday, Friday, Saturday show with Sunday left just for awards. In the three days, I took well over 1500 photos. Here are a few standouts:





The '59 Plymouth Suburban wagon and the 2-door '51 Plymouth wagon were both for sale in the car corral. The '68 Plymouth Belvedere wagon was just one of the mid-size B-body Mopar wagons on display.



For those that think the Chrysler show at Carlisle is only for muscle car era Mopars, let me assure you, that is not the case. A sampling of early cars were also on display, like this '47 DeSoto sedan, and a couple of '20s or early '30s Chryslers.







The Virgil Exner era of finned "Forward Look" Mopars is always well represented at the Chrysler show at Carlisle. Among the several '55-'56 Dodge 2-door hardtops, was a lavender, black and white 1956 Dodge Le Femme. This was a model Dodge marketed to its female customers. It included ac-

cessories like an umbrella, raincoat and pocketbook that matched the car's upholstery.



Letter series 300's were the next largest representation of finned cars, like this white 1957 300C and 1960 300F.





Dodge trucks and vans have always been popular, so classic Dodge trucks are always well represented. The Lil Red Express trucks have their own class. This one towed its own "mini me" Lil Red trailer. Little A-100 vans and pickups also have their own class.

The factory purple Dodge Adventurer 4x4 Power Wagon was a stunning 1 of 1 Plum Crazy truck. The early '60s Dodge pickup had Canada plates.





Chargers are always a big part of the event, and every year is well represented. The light green Charger is a '73-'74 SE model. The most numerous Chargers are the '68-'70 models, like this bronze '70.

Among the A-body Dodges were this blue '68 Dart GTS convertible which came from South Carolina and was the replacement car for a guy who sold his previous collector car to me, and this yellow '68 Dart Swinger. Next, an A-body '65 Plymouth Valiant convertible.







B-bodies in the '70s: blue '71 Road Runner *[note the Acme front license plate].* Then a butterscotch '71 GTX.





More B-bodies: The maroon car is a '66 Plymouth Belvedere II. The light blue '66 Coronet 500 has a Hemi under the hood.





One of the AMCs in the show, a Big Bad Orange '79 Javelin.



You've seen this photo before, but it bears repeating, as no Mopar show is complete without winged cars like this white Superbird, on its way to the field.
