**Duane & Bonnie Catlett's
1990 Dodge Dakota Convertible**

A Drop-Top Dakota with Fond Family Memories by the Catlett Family

Every once in a while, a vehicle shows up in our club that makes you do a double take—not just because of what it is, but because of the story it carries with it. This 1990 Dodge Dakota Convertible is one of those rare finds: equal parts automotive curiosity and living family heirloom.

A Rare Breed on the Road

Back in 1989 and 1990, Dodge did something bold. Partnering with Carroll Shelby, they produced a limited run of Dakota Sport pickups fitted with a factory-authorized convertible conversion. Estimates vary slightly depending on the source, but most enthusiasts agree that only about 3,000 units were produced across both years—with 1990 models representing the final and smaller batch.

Today, surviving examples are increasingly scarce. While exact numbers are hard to pin down, many collectors believe only a fraction—perhaps a few hundred—remain in well-preserved condition. That makes any example special. But this one? This one is personal.

From Showroom to Snowstorm

In May of 1990, Bonnie and Duane Catlett drove off the lot at Clarke Motors right here in Winchester, Virginia with their new Dakota convertible—a head-turner then and even more so now. Like many cherished vehicles, it wasn't a daily driver but rather something to be enjoyed occasionally, especially when the weather was just right for that open-air experience.

That changed—at least temporarily—in the wake of the legendary March 1993 blizzard. In the spring following the storm, the Catlett daughters enlisted the Dakota for a cabin fever busting joy ride around town; bed full of melting snow. Unfortunately, the shifting weight proved too much, and the truck bed was bent in the process.

It's the kind of moment that, in many stories, marks the beginning of the end for a vehicle. But not here.

A Life in Storage—and in Memory

After the truck bed was replaced, the Dakota was carefully stored in Winchester, where it remained largely untouched for over a decade. Around 2004, the story took a new turn when the Catletts' daughter, Jenn, brought the truck back into active life, moving it to her home in Richmond.

A few years later, in 2008, Jenn relocated to Miami—and the Dakota, almost as if guided by instinct, found its way back home to Winchester. Since then, it has rested once again in Bonnie and Duane's garage, quietly preserving its place in both automotive and family history.

Passing the Keys to the Next Generation

Recently, though, the Dakota saw daylight again—and for a purpose that would make any enthusiast smile.

Bonnie and Duane's grandson, Micah, chose this unique truck as his classroom for learning to drive a manual transmission. There's something fitting about that: a rare vehicle, built in an era when driving was a more tactile experience, now helping to pass those same skills to a new generation.

More Than a Truck

Plenty of vehicles are rare. Fewer have stories. And fewer still continue to evolve as part of a family's shared experience.

This 1990 Dakota convertible isn't just a limited-production oddity—it's a thread connecting decades of memories in Winchester. From showroom pride to snowstorm mishap, from long storage to a grandson learning the clutch, it reminds us why we care about these machines in the first place.

Because in the end, it's not just about what survives—it's about what stays with us.

There were a few mid-'60s Sunbeams in the show including a red Tiger MK I and a blue Tiger MK II. The MK I had a 260 Ford V8, The MK II had the Ford 289, The MK II differed in appearance with chrome headlight rings and an egg crate grille.



There were many convertibles in the show including this '69 Chrysler Newport. One of the Alfa Romeos was this yellow 2000 Spyder. There was only one Nash Metropolitan present.

The color doesn't matter on a VW bus. Everyone seems to love seeing those vintage VW's. The Jaguar XK-120 was a rare sight. There were several first-generation Monte Carlos in the show. Three of them that were parked together included a green 1970 model. The maroon '65 Mercury Comet Cyclone attracted several admirers.

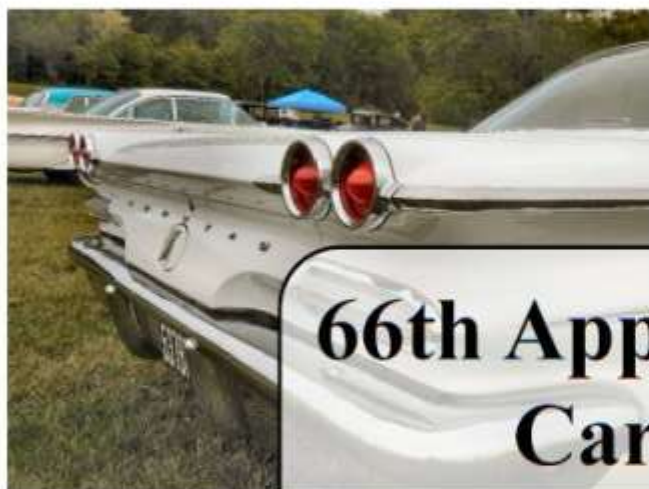

Driving Directions to Round Hill Church

2993 Northwestern Pike,
Winchester, VA 22603

Starting just west of Winchester Medical Center, from the intersection of Route 37 and Route 50:

- Drive west on Route 50 (Northwestern Pike) for approximately 2 miles.
- Shortly after crossing Nat'l Lutheran Boulevard, turn left on Route 654 (Poorhouse Road). There is a used car lot on the left as a landmark.
- At 0.2 miles, turn right onto Route 803 (Round Hill Road). Winchester Independent School across the road is a landmark at this intersection.
- At 0.3 miles, turn right at the Church rear driveway (Trinity Lane) and uphill into the parking lot. There is a sign at the driveway entrance.

Fellowship Hall entry is at the bottom level, rear of the Church, off the parking lot.

If you miss the Church rear driveway:

- Continue on Route 803 until it curves uphill and meets Route 50.
- Turn right onto Route 50, driving east.
- At 0.5 miles, turn right directly into the front driveway of the Church.

Proceed left around the building to rear parking lot.
