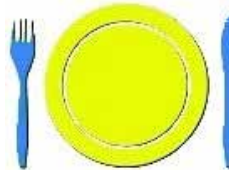

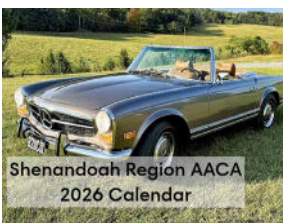

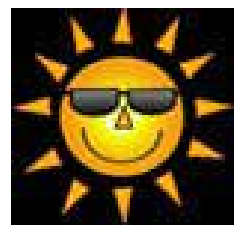
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Sunshine Report

AUGUST CAR of the MONTH



David & Georjean Coco's 1931 Pierce-Arrow

In 1959, Drew Navarre of New Orleans, LA, was looking for an antique automobile. He put requests out to his contacts and soon was presented with numerous cars which were available. One of these was a 1931 Pierce-Arrow phaeton, all original and in good running order. The car had come through Henry Austin Clark, a well-known collector in New York, and was priced at \$900, a fair sum in 1959.

Drew made arrangements to buy the car, and he and John "Buddy" Walton flew to NY, acquired the car, and drove it back to New Orleans. They experienced only one flat tire on the trip back and had some braking issues going down hills. Buddy asked Drew once on a downhill road, don't you think you should slow down a little? Drew's reply, I've been trying to! Drew then restored the car and drove it to numerous shows and tours in Louisiana and the surrounding states, usually accompanied by Buddy in his 1929 Cadillac roadster. They never trailered the cars, though he did add an overdrive to the Pierce, so it became quite comfortable at highway speeds.



I first met Drew and the car in 1966, when I was 15 years old, at a car show in my hometown of Alexandria, LA. I had a 1931 Chevrolet I'd restored (started restoring it at 13 years old) and so toured quite a bit with Drew

and Buddy. I was impressed with the Pierce, and by the mid-1980s I'd already owned four other Pierce-Arrow cars.

I was looking for another open Classic in the mid-1980s, and I knew that Buddy's 1929 Cadillac roadster was for sale. On tour at Avery Island, LA (home of McIlhenny Tabasco sauce company), I was discussing the Cadillac with Buddy, when he stated David, you don't want the Cadillac, you want Drew's Pierce. Well yes, I replied, but it's never been for sale. Buddy said go talk to him, he'll sell you the car. I walked over to Drew, and five minutes later owned the car!



Originally green and khaki, I drove the car quite a bit, and after a move to Virginia had an engine fire in the Pierce coming back from a Sully car show. Eric Kirk helped me put out the fire at Paris Mountain on Highway 50, I'm sure he remembers the angst involved, and while the fire was put out, the car was a mess from two fire extinguishers and a gallon of water poured on the engine. I decided to restore the car again, but changed colors, as I was a big fan of the car but not a fan of the original colors.

I've owned the car for over 40 years now, and it still is my favorite car out of a lot of others owned over the years. My wife, Georjean, has even stated that when I pass she'll cremate me and put my ashes in one of the door pockets, so I can be with the Pierce forever! Just kidding, I think....

GRAHAM OWNERS MEET

The 2026 Graham Owners Club International Meet was held in Roanoke, VA at the Hyatt Place Airport Hotel from June 22-28. The event also includes Paige, Jewett, Graham-Paige, and Graham Bro. trucks. Day by day activities were many and varied and kept the 80+ attendees on the move.

Monday was arrival and get-reacquainted day, meeting old friends and meeting new people. But included seeing Black Dog Salvage and the Taubman Museum of Art.

Tuesday was the day I left for the event. It started raining as soon as I pulled the trailer and Paige out of the garage. It rained hard all the way to Staunton, but I-81 south was not real busy. I missed The National D-Day Memorial visit and the Bedford Boys Tribute Museum.

Wednesday was the trip to the Sink collection, a private GM Collection by invitation only, and a tour of the Dixie Cavern. Thursday was a tour to The Natural Bridge State Park and a morning walk under the Bridge. Lunch was at the Pink Cadillac Diner, and the afternoon was a visit to the Safari Park and zoo, where we toured in tractor-pulled wagons with seating for 28. We required 2 wagons. This was the hottest day at 94. But we were allowed to feed the animals from prepared containers of pelleted grains.

Friday was a local trip up Mill Mountain to see the view of the Roanoke Valley and city, do photographs, and look up at the Roanoke Star, which was lit at night in red, white and blue for the 250 celebration. We could see it from our Hotel. We visited the O. Winston Link Museum and vintage rail terminal. Link was a photographer of much renown, specializing in railroad locomotives taken mostly at night and creating stunning pictures by flash bulbs and spotlights. A must-see for railroad enthusiasts. Late afternoon and evening was a party at the Virginia Transportation Museum to view the car museum and the trains on display, quite the treat.

Saturday was show day for not only the Grahams but for all cars through 2000. This is known as Star City Motor Madness Car Show, with close to 200 cars in downtown Roanoke. All 16 of the Graham Club cars attended. We were placed at the Square in downtown. All was good until 2:00PM when the sky opened up, just as trophies were being awarded. They give only 2- one for vintage ('26 Paige) and one for modified (Lamberdini). The only votes for these awards were by the crowd of walk-throughs.

Early Friday, David Wilkins came down and helped me by driving the car and participating in the Friday and Saturday activities. Thank goodness he did, as on the way back to the Hotel we ran through water as deep as 10" on Saturday. David's aunt, who lives in Roanoke, did a great job of helping us avoid more deeply flooded streets. The Paige did great, never missed a beat, but the modern low-slung cars were in real trouble.

The Graham Banquet was held at the VA Transportation Museum in the main aisle between the cars, with 2 Paige cars attending. **The '26 Paige did well in the awards, winning Best in Division and Best in Show.** First time a Paige has ever done this.

There were 80 people attending from all over the world - the longest distance was a couple from New Zealand. Eighteen states were represented. Cars from WA state ('31 Graham-Paige dual cowl phaeton, 3 Hollywoods (NC, MI, and IN), 1 Spirit of Motion (Sharknose combination coupe PA). All in all, a very successful event by Graham standards. Home and car in the garage by 1:30 Sunday.

SULLY CAR SHOW JUNE 21

Sunday June 21, 2026. A beautiful, sunny, first day of summer. But it was also Father's Day, and that meant it was the day of the 51st annual Sully Antique Car Show in Chantilly, Virginia. The show is put on by the George Washington Chapter of the Model A Ford Club of America, and the Fairfax County Park Authority. This year was the first year that there would be no vendors allowed (except for authorized food vendors), and there would be no car corral. Starting last year all cars had to be pre-registered. There would be no day of show registrations. Although it streamlined the entry and prevented a large backup from forming, it certainly kept some cars away. But, it's still a great show. And there were nearly 300 cars in the show.



Most of the Packards in the show dated from the early '30s to the early '40s. The white one was a '33 model. One of the AMCs that attracted attention was the red '73 Javelin AMX.

The '60 Edsel Ranger **[top left column, page 8]** was the only Edsel in the show this year. But it's been a regular at this show throughout all the decades that I've been attending.

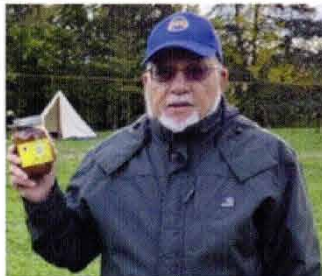

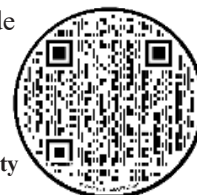

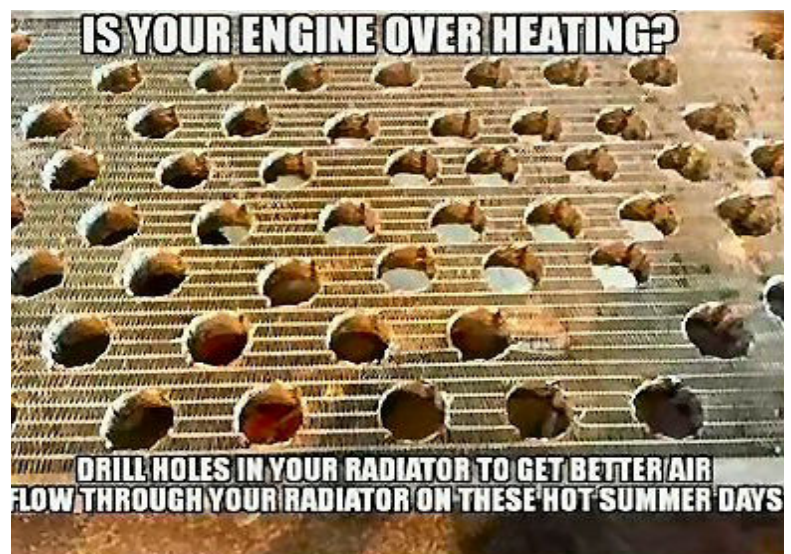
